Restore La. Task Force Meets Oct. 27 in Covington

Resolution to Reallocate Funding Within Rental Programs

BATON ROUGE, La. – The Restore Louisiana Task Force meets at 9:30 a.m. on Friday, Oct. 27 at the Covington City Council chambers at 222 E. Kirkland St. in Covington. The meeting will be live-streamed through the task force website at restore.la.gov and on the Restore Louisiana [Facebook](#) page.

Task force members will be briefed on progress regarding the Restore Homeowner Assistance Program, the Landlord Rental Program and the Small Business Assistance Program.

In addition, a resolution will be considered to reallocate \$4.7 million from the Multifamily Restoration Loan Program to the Neighborhood Landlord Program and \$17.7 million to the Piggyback Program. Both the Neighborhood Landlord and the Piggyback programs are designed to increase the number of affordable rental housing units.

Homeowners impacted by the March or August 2016 floods are urged to complete the Restore Louisiana [survey](#), regardless of whether they believe they qualify for assistance. The survey is a required first step of the homeowner assistance program and helps ensure that awards are made in the most efficient manner possible.

About the Restore Louisiana Task Force

The Restore Louisiana Task Force comprises 21 individuals from throughout the state who were appointed by Gov. John Bel Edwards to oversee the rebuilding process after historic flooding in March and August 2016 impacted 51 disaster-declared parishes. The
